## DUAL ENROLLMENT OPTIONS

Crown offers Dual Enrollment to qualified high school students who are non-Minnesota residents. This program permits students to earn college credit, which may be applied to a degree program at Crown or transferred to another institution. Students can take classes online with other high school students. The courses are taught by Crown's credentialed faculty members, have a low student to instructor ratio, and are offered in a 15-week semester format. All students are supported by a dedicated academic advisor.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available to students who attended Crown as dual-enrolled students and then enroll as full-time first-year students the following academic year. The maximum amount of this renewable scholarship is \$2,000 per year if attending on campus. Students must demonstrate financial need as determined by the FAFSA. Students enrolling in the School of Online Studies are eligible for a 25% off tuition scholarship.

## APPLICATION INFO

Students must have a minimum 3.0 high school GPA.

*No standardized tests are required for admission.*

August 1 (Fall) or December 1 (Spring)

### To register, students must complete the following:

- An online Crown application
- An official high school transcript
- A PSEO Advising form
