DUAL ENROLLMENT OPTIONS

Crown offers Dual Enrollment to qualified high school students who live in Nebraska or Iowa. This program permits students to earn college credit, which may be applied to a degree program at Crown or transferred to another institution.

The courses are taught by Crown's credentialed faculty members, have a low student to instructor ratio, and are offered in a 15-week semester format. All students are supported by a dedicated academic advisor. Courses are offered fully online or in a hybrid (face-to-face and online) format.

Hybrid classes in Nebraska are held in-person at The Porch on the Christ Community Church campus: 10845 Harney St. Omaha, NE 68154.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available to students who attended Crown as dual-enrolled students and then enroll as full-time first-year students the following academic year. The maximum amount of this renewable scholarship is \$2,000 per year if attending on campus. Students may also qualify for additional aid. Students must demonstrate financial need as determined by the FAFSA. Students enrolling in the School of Online Studies are eligible for a 25% off tuition scholarship.

APPLICATION INFO

- Students must have a minimum 3.0 high school GPA
- No standardized tests are required for admission

Application Deadlines:

August 1 (Fall) and December 1 (Spring)

Registration Requirements:

- An online Crown application
- An official high school transcript
- An advising form

Tuition and Fees:

- Tuition is \$90/Credit
- In-person classes have an additional \$180 Enhanced Course fee
- Books are free in all classes

Typical 3 credit course costs:

- \$90/credit x 3 credits = \$270+\$180
Enhanced Course Fee = **\$450 total**

FALL COURSES 2024

CLASS	DESCRIPTION	CREDIT
ENG1510: College Writing and Research	This course emphasizes the fundamentals of effective writing in the context of rhetoric: writer, audience, and purpose. Students write narrative, informative, and persuasive compositions and a documented research paper.	3
MAT2230: Statistical Concepts	The basic concepts and techniques of statistical inference are introduced. Topics include frequency distribution, central tendency, probability, standardized distributions, and hypothesis testing.	3
MAT131: College Algebra	This course provides a short review of Algebra II, followed by a concise study of algebraic, polynomial, exponential and logarithmic functions and their graphs. Linear, quadratic and systems of equations are included, along with their applications. This course provides a foundation for students wishing to take calculus. *Prerequisite: High School Algebra II	3
PSY130: General Psychology	This course is designed to provide a broad overview of the field of psychology. Topics include research in psychology, the brain and nervous system, sensation and perception, memory, emotion, learning, psychological disorders and psychotherapy. This introductory course aims to help students think deliberately and skillfully about human behavior and mental processes.	3

SPRING COURSES 2025

CLASS	DESCRIPTION	CREDIT
BUS130: Personal Finance	A practical study of what Scripture says about financial stewardship, tithing, giving, investing, and the use of debt. Students will develop personal budgets and financial goals. Discussion will also include the use of various types of credit and insurance.	3
ENG1512: Literary Analysis	Continued instruction and practice in writing and the writing process are the focal points of this course, with emphasis on critical analysis of literary genres. *This course is equivalent to ENG 132 *Prerequisite: ENG 131	3
MAT1410: Pre-calculus	This course covers concepts that are foundational for calculus. Topics include trigonometry, analytic geometry, probability, vectors, sequences and series. Students will also be introduced to the topic of limits. *Prerequisite: MAT 131	3
SOC230: Sociology	This is a survey course of the basic concepts in the sociological study of society, culture, the self, social organizations, the range of associational life, and social process.	3
