General Emergency Information

What is the primary contact number for Campus Security?

The primary contact number for Campus Security is 952-446-4101.

Where can I access the Emergency Procedures Guide?

The Emergency Procedures Guide is available for download on the Crown College Campus Safety webpage.

What should I do if I witness an emergency on campus?

Immediately call 911 if the situation is life-threatening. After contacting emergency services, inform Campus Security at 952-446-4101.

Are there regular emergency drills conducted on campus?

Yes, Crown College conducts regular emergency drills to ensure preparedness among students and staff.

How can I report a non-urgent safety concern?

For non-urgent concerns, contact Campus Security at 952-446-4101. Or fill out our suspicious activity form here.

Medical Emergencies

What steps should I take during a medical emergency?

Call 911 immediately if the situation is life-threatening. Then, contact Campus Security at 952-446-4101 and stay with the individual until help arrives.

Does Crown College offer first aid and CPR training?

Yes, the Emergency Medical Training Institute at Crown College offers courses like Heartsaver First Aid CPR AED.

Fire Safety

What should I do if I discover a fire on campus?

Activate the nearest fire alarm, evacuate the building immediately, and call 911. Once safe, notify Campus Security at 952-446-4101.

Are there designated assembly areas during a building evacuation?

Yes, each building has specific assembly areas. Familiarize yourself with these locations as outlined in the Emergency Procedures Guide.

Severe Weather

How will I be informed about severe weather alerts?

Crown College utilizes an emergency notification system called Regroup to inform students and staff about severe weather conditions. Ensure your contact information is up-to-date to receive timely alerts.

Where should I seek shelter during a tornado warning?

Proceed to the lowest level of the building, away from windows and doors, preferably in interior rooms or designated storm shelters.

Campus Security

Is there 24/7 security coverage on campus?

Yes, Campus Security operates 24/7 to ensure the safety of the college community.

How can I request a safety escort on campus?

Contact Campus Security at 952-446-4101 to request a safety escort, available during evening and nighttime hours.

Hazardous Materials

What should I do in case of a chemical spill?

Evacuate the area immediately and avoid contact with the substance. Notify Campus Security at 952-446-4101 and provide details about the spill.

Are there specific procedures for handling blood or bodily fluid exposure?

Yes, avoid direct contact, use protective equipment if available, and report the incident to Campus Security promptly.

Utility Issues

Who should I contact in case of a utility problem, such as a power outage?

Report utility issues to Facilities Management Services at 952-446-4183. For after-hours concerns, call 952-412-3659.

What actions should I take during an elevator entrapment?

Use the emergency phone or alarm button inside the elevator to contact help and wait for trained personnel to assist.

Personal Safety
